

Bronchiectasis in the News

Bronchiectasis, dubbed Dickensian Lung Disease, highlighted UK news this month increased number of diagnoses and reports of death rates from the disease showing to be twice as high as those from the general population. The full article can be found here

The Lancet published an article reviewing the trials and tribulations of Bronchiectasis research developments during 2015 in this months journal of respiratory medicine. The article summarises the need for continued effort for further research and reiterates the need for large programmes such as the iABC Consortium.

Become a Bronchi-Expert!

In early 2015, the European Lung Foundation conducted a survey of 1000 bronchiectasis patients to ask their most important priorities for improving bronchiectasis care. A staggering 96% of respondents rated "improve awareness of bronchiectasis in community care services" as "important" or "very important" and 90% of patients wanted better education for primary care physicians on how to manage bronchiectasis exacerbations.
